President's Message

It's a start of New Year

Already one month has gone. A lot has been happening in our community and below are some highlights which are coming for this year.

Opening of OAUK Primary School in Macchu Beraja and Samet Shikhar Jatra



I am pleased to announce that school which had been sponsored by the OAUK, in Macchu Beraja is now ready and the formal opening ceremonies took place on Saturday 9th February 2019. A few of the OAUK Trustees together with several donors and other OAUK Members attended in Macchu Bereja.

Derasar Extension Work

For more than eighteen months now we have been trying to arrange for work visas for the specialist workers to come from India to carry out the necessary work on the extension to the Derasar. The officials from the Home Office have refused to grant visas on various grounds and even after we managed to get these decisions reversed, through administrative reviews, the entry clearances have still not been granted. Following the reversal of the original decisions the Entry Clearance Officers interviewed the workers and subsequently refused to grant the visas on minute grounds. The final decisions on granting of visas are made by the Entry Clearance Officers or their Managers and the applicants cannot appeal these decisions if the visas are refused.

We have now had to start the whole process again for a completely new team of workers and are arranging for them to submit their applications. Account has been taken of all the various issues raised by the officials during the back and forth communication, including rejections and subsequent reversals, for the previous team of workers as well as the grounds flagged up during the interview process. Every effort is also being made to ensure that the new team of workers is also better prepared for the interview stage and gets through it successfully. When we built the Deraser the application process was a lot simpler as we only had to apply for work permits which were granted under special consideration for the construction of the temple. Since then the whole Immigration system and its rules have been overhauled and changed, very significantly, making it quite complicated and difficult to bring in workmen from other countries for carrying out specialist works such as what we require for our temple.

Oshwal House Extension Work

Whist the work on this project has taken a lot longer than originally anticipated, we are pleased to report that it is now in its final stages and should be concluded over the next few weeks. Once completed it will provide additional modern facilities, for smaller functions, which will complement our existing two assembly halls

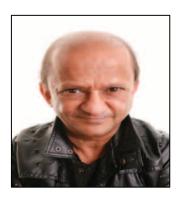

Dahiben Jivraj Karamshi Shah, Age 104 Years

Dahiben was born on 19th February 1915, and a daughter to Leelaben & Surabhai Parbat Shah (Navagam).

Dahiben was the eldest having 4 sisters and 2 brothers. Sadly all her brothers and sisters have passed away. Leelaben her mother was nearly blind and from a very young age Dahiben took on the responsibility of managing the house and looking after her brothers and sisters.

At a young age of 13 years she married Jivraj Karamshi Shah (Chela) and migrated soon after to Nairobi, Kenya. She was devastated to leave her family behind in India, but

'Inherently Unfair'

Inheritance Tax is widely viewed as unfair, and even the chancellor agrees it's complex: only effective and early planning can minimise its impact on your estate.

Well overdue, perhaps, was the news that Chancellor Philip Hammond had asked the Office of Tax Simplification (OTS) to review Inheritance Tax (IHT) with a view to simplifying the regime. In writing to the OTS, he acknowledged that "IHT, and the system within which it operates, is particularly complex".

Currently, if your net estate is worth more than the standard nil-rate band of £325,000, 40p in tax is charged for every pound that exceeds the threshold; except that, broadly, if you leave your main residence to a lineal descendant, £125,000 is added to that nil-rate band (rising to £175,000 in 2020/21). Unused elements of both allowances are transferrable on death to a surviving spouse or civil partner.

The regime has been criticised also for being discriminatory against those who do not own their own home, those who do not have children, and those who are not married or in a civil partnership.

Even if there is potential to simplify IHT exemptions, it's probably too much to hope that the tax will be scrapped. After all, a cash-strapped Exchequer seems increasingly reliant on taxing people's estates posthumously. In 2022/23, the UK's Exchequer is expected to raise £6.38 billion from IHT.1

That said, several governments around the world have convinced themselves that reforming or repealing estate taxes is vital to their political survival. If Donald Trump's ambition is realised, the United States will join a growing list of nations where taxing people's estates is being phased out or abandoned. Sweden abolished the practice in 2004, while Hong Kong and Russia did the same in 2006. In Norway, inheritance and gift taxes were abolished in January 2014.2

IHT is often referred to as a 'voluntary tax', and it does seem that inertia or ignorance is largely to blame for wealth ending up in the hands of the taxman rather than surviving family members. The fact is that with some careful planning, those with estates currently worth more than the nil-rate band can legitimately reduce their IHT liability, or possibly pay nothing at all.

In your gift

Gifts are normally included in the net estate for IHT purposes if they were made less than seven years before death. However, these gifts are ignored if they total less than £3,000 in any one tax year. This means that you can

make gifts of up to £3,000 in total in any tax year without attracting IHT. The £3,000 can be given to one person or it can be split between several people. If the exemption is not used in one tax year, it can be carried forward to the next year, potentially enabling a couple to remove £12,000 from their joint estate in just one tax year.

That money could be used to help with the financial challenges faced by younger family members; for example, topping up a child's pension or Junior ISA could go a long way to providing them with an invaluable head start in life. With the end of the tax year looming, this opportunity could be lost unless action is taken soon.

Those with sufficient surplus income may also want to take account of the 'normal gifts out of income' rule – if you make regular gifts out of income and in doing so don't affect your standard of living, the gifts are exempt from IHT. However, to reduce the possibility of a disagreement with HMRC, it is wise to seek professional help from a financial adviser or accountant.

While lifetime gifts can significantly reduce an IHT liability, it's worth noting that if you don't take time to write a valid Will, your estate will be handled according to the laws of intestacy. If you die intestate, you will have no control over how your estate is distributed, and rather than everything passing to a spouse or civil partner, a proportion could be transferred to descendants, triggering a potential IHT liability.

If your children's share is worth more than the individual IHT threshold, they could be liable to pay 40% tax on anything they inherit over that amount. This could be avoided by writing a Will that leaves assets worth up to the tax-free threshold of £325,000 to children, with the balance of the estate left to a surviving spouse. But there may be even better options, depending on circumstances, through the use of trusts.

Take advice

IHT often falls on the ill-prepared and unadvised. That's why it's important to seek financial advice, so that all your assets are properly protected. Shockingly, fewer than a fifth of over-55s have taken action to reduce their potential IHT bill.3

The levels and bases of taxation, and reliefs from taxation, can change at any time and are dependent on individual circumstances.

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Oshwal Trek 2018- Everest Base Camp

On 5th October 2018, 30 Oshwal trekkers eagerly awaited their arrival into Kathmandu. Stepping foot into Kathmandu filled me with excitement knowing I was so close to starting an adventure of a lifetime, never had a I felt such a sensory overload with a gusting level of sights, sounds and smells all hitting us at once. Kathmandu had a certain air of charisma that we hadn't experienced before. From travelling in a rickshaw, barrelling through the traffic-jammed alleyways of old town, to

marvelling through the medieval temples in Durbar Square or dodging trekking touts in the backpacker district of Thamel - Kathmandu was certainly a beautiful city to begin our expedition in.

On Sunday 7th, the much awaited day arrived – our departure to Lukla! Appropriately labelled the world's most dangerous airport at 2843m high and only a 527m runway, we arrived with our bright orange duffel bags eagerly waiting to board the flight. We were transported in a minibus to the airside where we all sat in front of a small and compact "Summit air" propeller plane in awe, thinking "will we survive this, let alone base camp!". As we buckled our seatbelts, I could feel the adrenaline rush as we prepared for the 30 minute rollercoaster. We felt every jolt of wind and motion of turbulence, but all of which was forgotten as we looked

out to the spectacular views of crisp white, snow filled mountains and their untouched valleys – so calm and peaceful! To my surprise the landing was incredibly smooth, a testament to the highly skilled pilots.

And so the hike began. The first day started with a gentle hike from Lukla-our route took us through numerous beautiful villages before arriving to a small village called Phakding,-4 hours later. The following day, after following the banks of the 'Dudh Kosi' river we arrived at a spectacular suspension bridge which marked the long uphill climb to Namache. Passing several beautiful prayer wheels with the chant Om Mani Padme Om intricately carved into them, we would pause to spin the wheels in a clockwise direction.



When the prayer wheels are turned, some of which were greater than 5ft, it is believed that the mantras are activated and purify negativity and generate compassion.

After crossing many suspension bridges, we finally made it to the famous Himalayan mountainside town, called Namche Bazaar. A distinct town on its own, a true get away from the Khumbu region. It was in this town trekkers could pick up any last-minute comforts including apple pie and reenergise before continuing our journey.

We spent 2 nights in Namache Bazar to acclimatise. Our acclimatisation walk entailed hiking to the] Everest Hotel which sat at an altitude of 3880m. Along the way we caught our first glimpse of Mt Everest (8,848m), Ama Dablam (6,665m) and Lhotse (8,500m). Seeing it in person, brought home the reality that we really were guests of the world's highest mountain.

It was so easy to keep your head down and concentrate on each foot step, but taking a moment to pause and reflect on the beautiful scenery would instantly motivate me to 'keep going' when I felt out of breath feeling of reaching Everest Base Camp was unreal! Such a proud moment! There we were surrounded by enormous mountain ranges in every corner we turned too.

I've come back from the trip feeling even closer to nature!

My gratitude goes to the positivity, motivation and willpower of the Sherpas; which I believe were the three qualities I too required to successfully achieve the goal I had set 6 months ago.

The following day the trail dropped down to the

'Dudh Kosi' river . We stopped for lunch in a small village called 'Punki Thanka', before embarking on a steep ascent through the 'rhododendron forest' which brought us to 'Tengboche' and its famous monastery. Tengboche lies at the base of Kantaiga and the spur of this ridge offers panoramic views of the main peaks of Khumbu including Everest, Lhotse and Ama Dablam. This little village is famous for the festival of Mani Rimdu, a celebration of empowerment. Normally celebrated during the months of October/November, celebrations entail locals the dancing to the Tibetan opera in the monastery courtyard. We arrived at

'Dingboche' 6 hours after leaving Tengboche

With everyone still in such high spirits, we spent the night sipping lemon and ginger tea by the yak-paddiepowered stove, laughing with our Sherpa hosts and playing cards

(I think we all became experts at 'Mafia' by the end of it) before enjoying the most delicious "daal bhat" which reminded us of our home cooked meals. We were starting to feel the altitude as we arrived to approximately 4400m and decided to spend another night in 'Dingboche' before we headed to 'Lobuche'.



We left the village of Lobuche at dawn on the 14th October 2018, with it being -10°C ;suffering from loss of appe tite and fatigue my feet struggled at the prospect of a 5 hour hike to Gorak Shep. This was certainly the toughest part of the hike for me personally, but with the prospect of not being able to turn back, and immense motivation from the rest of the group, we arrived at Gorek Shep at about 10.30am. Following a slight rest, an hour later, we left for a 3 hour hike to Everest Base Camp.

The feeling of reaching Everest Base Camp was unreal! Such a proud moment! There we were surrounded by enormous mountain ranges in every corner we turned too.

I've come back from the trip feeling even closer to nature! My gratitude goes to the positivity, motivation and willpower of the Sherpas; which I believe were the three qualities I too required to successfully achieve the goal I had set 6 months ago.

















On 7th October, 30 Oshwal trekkers landed in the world's most dangerous airport, Lukla - Nepal, to start their adventure of a lifetime. The 2 weeks spent trekking to Everest Base Camp and Gokyo Ri have left memories of vibrant colours, warm hospitality, tasty hot meals and stunning scenery and most of all we have gained new friends. The group worked hard to raise a fantastic [£30,000] which will help rebuild an entire school, Basnet Gaun School, which is located in Benighat Rorang Guapalika in the Dhadhing region of Nepal. The school was badly damaged during the April 2015 earthquake which has meant urgent repairs were required for the safety of the children.

The response was huge! The event was a sold out nearly a week before the event date!

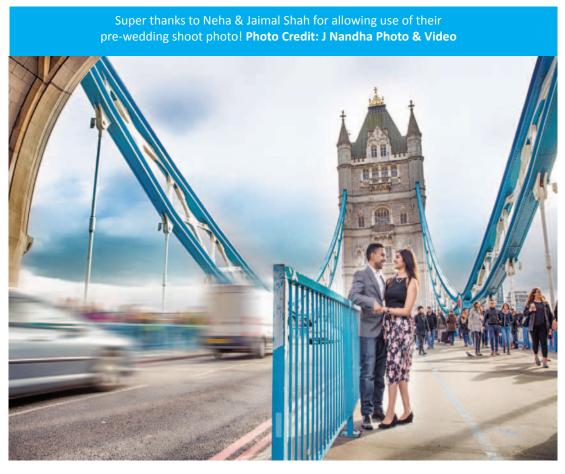
It was the last Friday before Christmas and almost everyone dressed in their festive best, with Christmas jumpers and all! A brilliant

Navagam Reunion

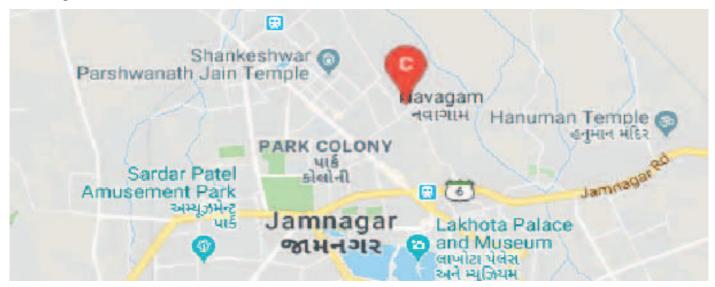

Botown at Oshwal Centre

On Saturday 26th January, India Republic Day, over 400 people attended a ground-breaking night at Oshwal Centre. In a twist to the wonderful traditional music nights hosted over the years, this special night hosted not one, but TWO modern music shows.

The first act was the legendary BOTOWN, a British Asian band who play a musical reimagining of the Bollywood genre, tinged with funk and soul of the Motown era, with a bold brass section. Formed in 2008 by lead singer and guitarist Ajay Srivastav, they have played live across the country for the last decade, and won accolades. Born and raised in North London, Ajay has worked alongside artists such as Jamiroquai, The Brand New Heavies,

Gregory Isaacs, Apache Indian and Bollywood legend Shah Rukh Khan. Infact the crowd were mesmerised by the live appearance of Shah Rukh Khan – OK – it was a life size card board cut out – but everyone had their selfie taken with him!





BOTOWN treated the crowd to numerous classics, including golden oldies such as 'Dum Maro Dum' from the 1971 film Hare Krishna Hare Rama, 'Roop Tera Mastana' from 1972's Aradhana, to the (slightly!) more recent 'Kajara Re' from the film Bunty Aur Babli (2005), and 2003's tear jerker 'Kal Ho Na Ho' from the film of the same name.

The audience spanned the entire age range, and for a Mehfil night there was a very big contingent of teenagers and younger adults. The clever way in which BOTOWN played Hindi tracks with a funky western feel certainly appealed to the younger crowd, but the older generation were equally thrilled. "Seven Stars!" commented one reveller. Bijal and Rita from West Area got into the 70's funk theme, donning afro hairstyles and rainbow soul glasses. 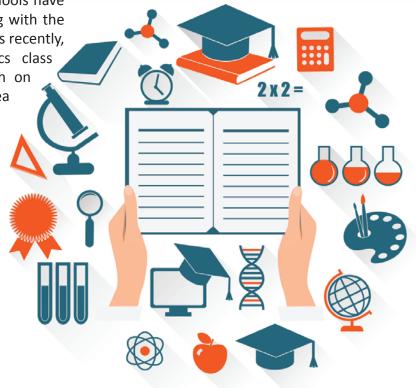
The techers have had two training

Venilal Virpar Shah was born in Nairobi in 1946 and Anila Venilal Shah was born in Goonj, in 1948. Financial difficulties were quite common in the old days, for this reason they couldn't complete their education due to the responsibilities of helping their family.

Got married in Kenya 1971 and then came to UK, here they worked in a factory / shop for a number of years. They have two daughters: Heena & Reena.

Since retirement, they make visits to Jamnagar annually. During one of their early trips, they stumbled across an orphanage without adequate facilities. Immediately they donated money and time to oversee work carried out to improve the building by installing cupboards, desks, chairs and other classroom facilities. The help they provided made the children happy, and to observe the change and sense the positive aura, touched their hearts. This was the start for them to begin charity work in Jamnagar on their annual trips.

The current charity work they do is for 'Narayan Seva Sansthan,' in Udaipur, Rajasthan. This charity was established in 1985 with a view to serve poor patients, mainly suffering from Polio and other birth disabilities, to have corrective surgeries free of charge. With the donation they have collected in the UK, the poor children and adults have been given the correct treatment, either medicinally or by surgery; and this has given them a new life. 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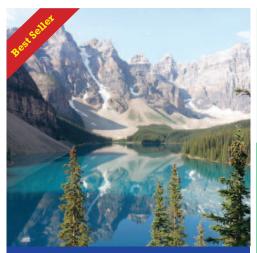






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Fun Club

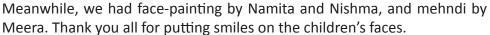


It wouldn't be NEYC without some physical activity! We began with a few rounds of

Meanwhile, we had face-painting by Namita and Nishma, and mehndi by Meera. Thank you all for putting smiles on the children's faces.

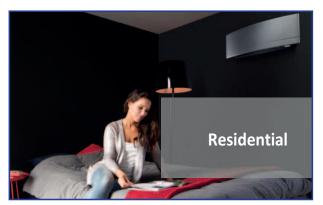

Jainism Classes at Ekta Centre by Dr. Ajit Shah

We have been running Jainism classes under the auspices of OAUK NW Area for many years. These are usually held for about 12 weeks on Friday nights, after Paryushan and normally last for about 2 hours.

The topics vary, but over the years we have covered many topics including Nav (9) Tatvas, Eight Karmas, the 12 vows of a Jain householder (Shravak), the life of Bhagwan Mahavir; The life of Lord Parsvanath; the life of Lord Aadinath; Jain Ramayan; Samyaktva—right knowledge; the 12 Bhavnas; the story of Samraditya Kevali; the meanings of Samayik & Chaityavandan Sutras and the 35 Virtues of a those who are ready to follow the path of a Jain Shravak (Marganusaripana no 35 Guna). All the teaching is illustrated by stories from Jain literature. The medium of instruction is Gujarati with English explanations wherever necessary, and this has worked well for most of the participants.

This year the classes are being held at Ekta Centre, as has been the case for a few years now, and the topic is the 35 Virtues of those who are ready to follow the path of a Jain Shravak. The timing for the classes this year is on Fridays from 8:00pm to 9:30pm. We have studied more than half the subject matter, and will finish in early February 2019, as there will be a break of a few weeks in January.

These classes give you an introduction to the vast knowledge held within our scriptures, and practical guidance on incorporating the principles of Jain Dharma in our thoughts, speech and deeds. Attendance varies because Fridays are difficult for many people to commit to on a regular basis. We have had between 10-40 people attending.

There is no charge for these classes. We have in the past requested participants to donate an amount of their choice to OAUK, which helps OAUK towards the expense involved in hiring out the space.

In addition, we run a more advance class for an hour every Wednesday as part of the Jain Pathshala, held at Kenton Derasar. I take an hour's lesson in this Pathshala from 9:00pm-10:00pm. Champaben Mansukhlal Shah runs and co-ordinates this group, which is very well attended. This is entirely in

Gujarati and it is more advanced. The topic this year is also the 35 / 21 virtues of those who are ready to follow the path of a Jain Shravak, but the emphasis

and the teaching method is different from the Friday classes.

In addition, this year, we run a fortnightly class on Thursdays at Jain Centre Colindale on the basics of Jainism. This class is completely in English and the participants are young people mainly.

Galley & Warden Hills Nature Reserve:

Enjoying Warden and Galley Hills Nature Reserve was Luton's first nature reserve and is the perfect place to enjoy a walk. There are three routes to choose from when exploring this common. You can avoid climbing the hills by taking a circular walk from Streatley village or you can climb up Warden Hill to enjoy the views across Luton from the top. The final route involves walking along part of the Icknield Way which is an ancient route that was used in the past for trade.

Wildlife

The chalk downland supports a huge variety of wild flowers and these attract rare insects and over 20 species of butterflies.



Features

"Drays ditches" run along the base of Warden Hill which were originally dug in the Bronze Age as boundaries to separate tribal groups. However, later on in the Iron Age these were built up as a way to control the traffic along the Icknield Way.

Near the top of Galley Hill two Bronze Age barrows can be found. These were excavated in the 1960s and the remains of 14 burials were found in the largest barrow. In the Middle Ages a gallows was built on top of one of the barrows to be used for public executions.





The Barton Hills National Nature Reserve offers enjoyable and peaceful walking trails in the Chilterns. A series of footpaths take you to the attractive downland, chalk grassland and beech woodland. It's delightful in the summer months with a variety of wildflowers attracting butterflies such as marbled white and dark green fritillary. Look out for vegetation including wild thyme, horseshoe vetch, marjoram and orchids as you make your way along the paths. It's a great area for wildlife too with lots of different birds and mammals such as stoats, weasels and hares. The walk can start from the little town of Barton-le-Clay which lies just to the north of the reserve or from continuation from the Warden hills. Follow the John Bunyan Trail through the town and south to the reserve.

To extend your walking in the area you can follow the John Bunyan Trail and the Icknield Way Path through the surrounding Bedfordshire countryside. The trails can take you east towards Hexton, Pegsdon and Pirton or south towards Luton. From there you can enjoy a climb with wonderful views over the surrounding area. Also nearby is the village of Streatley and Sundon Hills Country Park. This includes the climb to Sharpenhoe Clappers where there is an Iron Age Hillfort and more great views to enjoy.

Pegsdon Hills

Enjoy a climb to Deacon Hill and enjoy wonderful views over the Chilterns on this walk in the Pegsdon Hills. The hills are also a designated nature reserve so there's lots of interesting flora and fauna to see as well.

There's a series of footpaths to follow across the site where you will find chalk hills and wildflower meadows with orchids.. In the summer months the flowers attract butterflies such as dingy and grizzled skippers. There are fine views of the surrounding Chiltern Hills from the high points which reach nearly 172 metres at Deacon Hill.



On your walk you may see a deer and various birds including skylark, buzzard and fieldfare.





The newly formed Desi Ramblers have weekly walks in many of these Chiltern Hills namely Barton Hills, Ashridge Estate Tring and Wendover Hills. The hills provide a good training ground for all the challenges they take part in.

Beauty of Luton and the Chiltern Hills:

Luton owes its existence to its situation. Just to the north of the town are the springs that give rise to the River Lea and, all around, are the chalk hills. Over the years, the river has played an important part in the life of the town, not least in the powering of water mills that were recorded in the Domesday Book. The Chiltern Hills have provided chalk for building and also flint for tools. All is not lost in the past because the river and the hills are still wonderful places for children, and older folk too, to enjoy.

I discovered the hills purely by accident during my training for my first Himalayan high altitude trek in 2006 Ladakh India. Since then the Chiltern Hills has become a training ground for all trekkers based in the London and the South East.



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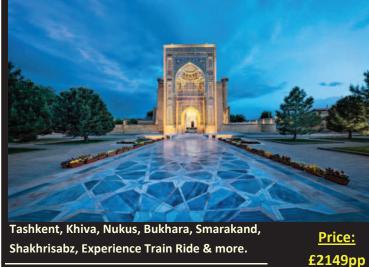
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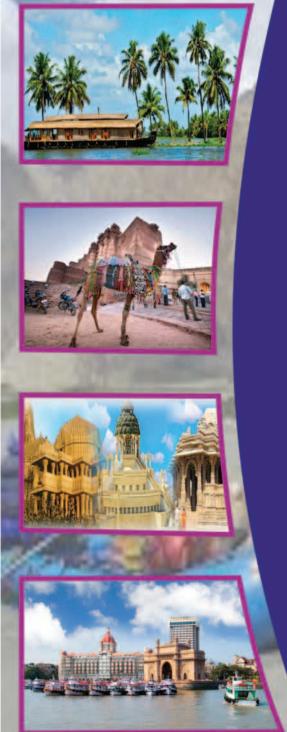

Congratualtions on the MBE to Ajaybhai

Oshwal Association of UK take pleasure in congratulating Mr Ajay Somchand Mulchand Gudka on being honoured with an MBE (Most excellent Order of the British Empire) in the Queen's 2019 Honours Awards. The MBE was awarded for services to Charity and the community in Gujarat, India.

Ajay was born in Kenya and did his early schooling at Visa Oshwal Primary school in Nairobi and then came to UK in 1971 for further studies. At Mill Hill School, he did his O & A levels and went on to do a degree in Print Technology at Watford college. An active sportsman, in 1979 he toured Far East with Angels Hockey team on a month-long tour — the team was one of the first British teams to go to China.

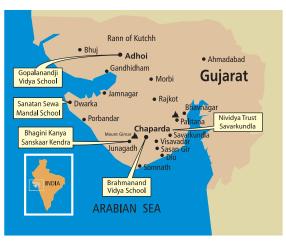
After getting some work experience in the print industry, he helped to start the family print business in St. Albans in 1987. Caprin Printers is still in business today and services small & medium size companies & organisations throughout London & Hertfordshire. As years passed, Ajay felt satisfied with his financial goals but found something deeply lacking in his personal life. From early on, especially after having lost his father at a young age, Ajay had an interest in spiritual matters and in discovering what happens to the soul once one's last breath leaves the body.

He found his calling when he met Pujya Muktanandji (affectionately known as Bapu) on a visit to Chaparda (Gujarat) in 1995. Bapu satisfied his thirst for spiritual knowledge and inspired Ajay on to the Nishkam Karma path (to provide selfless service to the poor and needy, without any expectation of any form of recognition or reward). In 1998 Bhagvatinandji Education & Health Trust ("BEHT"), a charitable Trust (Registration No. 1072109) was set up in the UK.

Since that time, in the past 20 years, under Ajay's tireless and enthusiastic guidance and leadership BEHT has organised countless number of fundraising events (Swimathons, Walkathons, Mehfils, Gujarati Naataks to name just a few!) to not only raise funds but also raise awareness within potential and actual donors of the situation in Gujarat and keep them posted of how the funds are being applied. Throughout this period, Ajay has been in

weekly contact with Bapu, and on average has personally visited Chaparda and the other rural areas of need about twice a year (often with his family, and entirely at his own expense). Therefore, he has been able to

keep tabs on what has been going on and provide reliable first-hand reports to all donors thereby giving them the necessary assurances. Collectively, through all these efforts and including some very generous donations from a few individual philanthropists but largely with the backing of the general Gujarati diaspora in the UK, some £3.5 million has been raised to date. That level of funding has been the catalyst for the establishment of 5 educational centres in Gujarat, in what was previously "zero" or just rural farmland space twenty years ago. Over 8,000 under-privileged children are currently receiving education and thousands more have done so over the last eighteen years, something that would not otherwise have happened. A school for blind children as well as several residential homes for the elderly have also been built in Chaparda.

In 2012, a hospital was built in Chaparda to serve the local community. After a few years of teething problems, the hospital is now treating about 200,000 patients annually, free of charge. The poverty level in rural areas is such that many people avoid going to a doctor when they have a health issue. They bear their pain in silence which in many cases ends up as a tragic fatality. In 2012, under BEHT's banner, Ajay led a group of

40 trekkers (20 from UK & 20 from USA) on Mt. Kilimanjaro Trek where they raised about £ 200K in total for the Hospital project.

When severe earthquakes struck Kutchh (Gujarat) in 2001 and Nepal in 2015 with devastating effects, Bapu was extremely prompt in mobilising relief efforts when they were most urgently required and Ajay made sure that BEHT raised as much funding as possible in a short space of time to support these efforts.

In summary, countless number of lives have been changed for the better, directly as a result of the path





that Ajay chose to adopt and has followed so diligently for the past twenty years.

It is a proud moment for the whole Jain and Oshwal community that one of its member has been recognised for his service to the poor and needy people and that in India.

A well-deserved honour indeed!
