


Indiraben's message:

I would like to thank Oshwal Association of the UK for putting my "Mother and Daughter" Sculpture on permanent display at Oshwal Centre. I started doing pottery and working with ceramics over 30 years ago and I thoroughly enjoyed it. My various works have been influenced by my wide travels, visiting art galleries and my love of nature. I did this piece about 17 years ago, inspired by scenes of mothers and daughters in Africa and India going about their daily business, such as shopping in the markets and fetching water... often carrying things on their heads.

I have thoroughly enjoyed living with this sculpture in my front garden and, by giving it to the Oshwal Association, it is my hope that this enjoyment will now be shared by the wider Oshwal community and other visitors. I also hope that future generations will be inspired to get involved in the arts, especially pottery and ceramics.









Nightmarch – a report of her time with the Maoists and Adivasi civilians they govern – provides one the most nuanced, informed accounts yet of this strange and awful conflict.

Between 2008 and 2010, the anthropologist Alpa Shah spent 18 months as a participant observer in India's largely rural state of Jharkhand. She lived among Adivasi's, tribal peoples outside the caste system who count among the communities most neglected by the government. Jharkhand is also one of the heartlands of India's Maoist insurgency, a civil war that in 2006 the country's prime minister identified as the "biggest internal security threat to the Indian state". For decades, Indian politicians and commentators have argued about the country's longstanding

Maoist war: are insurgents ideological terrorists fixated on an outdated creed, or are they desperate rebels with a cause, forced to take up guns by state brutality? Dissatisfied by this polarised debate, Shah decided to immerse herself in the communities who live alongside the insurgents, to explore what the rebellion looks like from the grassroots.

KANTI NAGDA CEO of Sangat Centre was invested with MBE (Most Excellent Order of the British Empire) by Her Majesty The Queen in New Year 2020 Honour List for services to charity in UK.

KANTI NAGDA is a distinguished social activist who has made a difference to his community. Kanti was a victim of Idi Amin's expulsion of Asians from Uganda in 1972. He arrived in the UK with £50 in his pocket. Kanti started charity work while working for a company and later on joined Harrow Council as a social worker. In 1982 Kanti founded Sangat Centre and bought a building. The building was inaugurated by Their Royal Highnesses The Earl and Countess of Wessex. The Centre today provides legal advice and representation at immigration and welfare benefits tribunals to over 2000 people of all nationalities and backgrounds per year.



Nishma Gosrani has been invested with an OBE in the Queen's New Year 2020 Honours List for promoting diversity and inclusion in all aspects of British life. She pioneered Gender Pay Gap reporting and the subsequent changes to the UK's Equality Act. Her address titled 'Equality Matters' on International Women's Day 2016 led to a rare standing ovation from the public gallery at the House of Commons.

Kenyan born but now London based Nishma Gosrani is a Director at Deloitte Consulting and leads People Transformation in Banking, Capital Markets and Asset Management with a key focus on partnering with clients on the 'Future of Work' agenda. She was recipient of Asian Professional of the Year Award in 2007.

She sponsors the Deloitte Multicultural Network which won 'Employee Network of the Year' at the BiTC Awards in 2015. She was listed as a Financial Times Top 35 Future leader in 2016. She is a board member of Tamasha Theatre Company which champions BAME artists from culturally diverse backgrounds. She has been recently appointed as a Governor and Trustee of St Alban's High School for Girls.

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OAUK Gujarati Schools, Rekha Shah, Education EC Jai Jinendra to Oshwal members, parents, grandparents and children.

The schools have seen some major changes since I took up the role as education trustee. There has been amazing achievements with the GCSE results and A level results . 4 out of the very few candidates who took A level Gujarati were from our schools.

Teaching has improved immensely, in the schools, adopting newer techniques use of white boards, games, music, learning through play. As the examination board has changed, there are now, new challenges to overcome, and every attempt is being made to build on resources for higher education to GCSE and A level. Although the standards have been raised at GCSE level, the exams are tiered and can be taken at two levels.

Our Schools offer cultural classes, additional magic maths classes and some incorporate all the cultural learning, participating in activities at festival times. Overall all four schools work very well on their own and have done some amazing events within the school. The South had a Summer Mela and the Prefects annual show, where the parents had a huge input and not only were they successful event, but managed to raise money. The West area school has recently increased their numbers, by fun learning, through play, every Friday evening.

In the past magazine, we told you about our exceptional variety programme. Although the schools are miles apart and the venue being Oshwal Centre, children performance was outstanding. We, also had the opportunity for a filming session to be done at Woodhouse College by Binduben, who is currently working on a documentary film on Halari Oshwals.

We had a teachers' training session in July, in conjunction with the Consortium of Gujarati schools, where, Jagdishbhai Dave, the legendary author of Gujarati books, the founder of Gujarati Literary honoured us with his presence and gave a presentation on Gujarati, how to incorporate grammar in our teaching, with an insight into Gujarati literature, which is now going to be a part of Gujarati A level exam. He had made the session so magical, with his expertise. CGS is now in the process of putting up a Gujarati website, "Educate to Inspire," for all the schools, aided by Ashishbhai. This will be a big achievement.

Our teachers are extremely hard- working, dedicated, more time-focused and willing to adapt new methods to inspire children. Our Education meeting in November ,attended by teachers, education portfolio holders and area chairs, proposed new ideas , mainly, Parents meeting, sharing ideas and work, amongst teachers, one to one teachers meetings with the portfolio holders, bringing Jainism, organising central events like interschool camp at OC, making school trips. These will be the forthcoming changes in the near future.

Overall, the numbers of students are depleting in all our schools, it has become even more difficult to sustain the schools. I urge all prospective parents to consider enrolling their children to our schools. It is a rare opportunity for children to imbibe cultural, family, religious values in our children that will become their foundation of their future life.

I would like to build a younger sub-team to take over the organisation of meetings, functions, training sessions, centrally. All Oshwals, interested or involved within the Education system could make our community a much better place for our future generation, by giving some of their valuable time to us and supporting us.

Just to give a little flavour of teaching, I would like to include article, I wrote for the presentation at the teachers training, on our environment.

" પ્લાસ્ટિક કે પ્લેનેટ"

આપણી આસપાસ નજર દોડાવીએ તો એ વાત માની ન શકાય કે માંડ એકાદ સદી પફેલાં, પ્લાસ્ટિક શું છે તે કોઇ જાણતું પણ ન હતું. આજે પ્લાસ્ટિક યોતરફ છે. પ્લાસ્ટિક પોયું કે અકળ જોઇએ તેવું બનાવી શકાય; વાળ્યુ વળે અને મનગમતો આકાર આપી શકાય તેવો પદાર્થ છે. પ્લાસ્ટિકથી બનાવેલી સુવિધાઓ પાર વગરની છે.

ઘણા સમય વપરાય એવા તબીબી સાધનો, ગાડીઓમાં, કમ્પ્યુટરમાં, રમકડાંઓ બનાવવામાં પ્લાસ્ટિકનો વપરાશ થાય છે. તેમ છતાં, ઘણી એવી વસ્તુઓ પણ છે જે એકજ વખત વપરાતા પ્લાસ્ટિકની બનેલી હોય છે. પ્લાસ્ટિકની પાણી અને દૂધની બાટલીઓ, ખરીદીની થેલીઓ વગેરે ઘરોઘર, હાલતા-યાલતા વાપરીએ છીએ.

અત્યારનાં ભાગદોડ જીવનમાં, સમય ઓછો હોવાના કારણે, કામેથી ઘરે આવતાં, ઉપહારગ્રહમાંથી "ટેક-અવે" મંગાવે છે (તૈયાર કરેલું ભોજન જે પ્લાસ્ટિકના વાસણોમાં પીરસાય કે વેંચાય છે તે). પ્લાસ્ટિકનાં ડબ્બાઓ, ઢાંકણાં, કપ, ચમચીઓ, નાના મસાલાના પડીકાઓ, બધુંજ ભોજન પીરસવામાં વપરાય અને જમ્યા બાદ ઘરમાં, કચેરીમાં, રસ્તામાં, રેલગાડી મથકે, વિમાનમથકે કચરાના ડબ્બામાં ભરપૂર જોવા મળે.

પ્લાસ્ટિકનો કયરો જમીન પર ભેગો થતાં, મોટા ઉકરડાં ભરાય છે જેને બાળવાથી હવાનું પ્રદૂષણ વધે છે. પ્લાસ્ટિકનો કયરો જ્યારે સમૂદ્રમાં પ્રવેશ કરે ત્યારે દરિયાઇ પ્રદૂષણ ઉદ્દભવે છે. પ્લાસ્ટિકનાં ઝેરી રસાયણો પાણીમાં ભળે ત્યારે નાના રજકણો યોટેલા હોય છે. આ રજકણો માછલી, પક્ષીઓ ખાય છે અને માણસો આહારમાં માછલી વગેરેનું ભોજન કરતાં, તેમના શરીરનું નુકસાન કરે છે.

આપણે જે પ્લાસ્ટિક ફેંકી દઇએ છીએ તેનો વિચાર વિજ્ઞાનિકો પણ, તેના તારણો જાણીને હેબતાય ગયા છે. ફક્ત ભારત દેશમાં, વર્ષે યાર હજાર ટન પ્લાસ્ટિકનો કચરો ભેગો થાય છે અને ચારસો વર્ષ સુધી પણ નાશ પામશે નહીં. આ સમસ્યા કુદરત માટે ગંભીર છે અને સરકારને તેનું નિવારણ શોધવું પડશે.

પૃથવીને કેવું નુકસાન થઇ રહ્યું છે તે મૂદ્દો વિશ્વ સમક્ષ લાવવા 'નેશનલ જ્યોગ્રાફિકે' : "પ્લાસ્ટિક કે પ્લેનેટ" નામે ઝુંબેશ ઉપાડી છે. જગત પર્યાવરણનાં દિવસે, આ વર્ષે, ભારતમાં, "પ્લાસ્ટિક પ્રદૂષણથી બયાવો" નો મૂદ્દો જાહેર કર્યો છે પણ આ સમસ્યાનો નિવારણ લાવવો તે લક્ષમાં રાખશે કે નહીં તેની મને ખબર નથી.

The wedding show recently arranged in 2019 was a fantastic, colourful event and a very joyous occasion. Chandrapur Medical Camp

to treat 10,000+ patients in a mega medical camp. With



an economy primarily dependent on mining, Chandrapur remains severely underdeveloped with limited access to quality medical facilities, and residents exposed to increased health risks. Excessive tobacco consumption has led to severe dental problems with many of them being at a pre-cancerous stage (9 out of 10 men consume Khara/chewing

tobacco). Malnutrition has led to stunted growth and low immunity in children. Back and knee pains are common amongst those working in manual jobs within the farms and cotton fields.

26 volunteers from the UK and a host of volunteers from Mumbai decided Christmas is best served serving others. This may sound egocentric but volunteering in this way is one of the most rewarding acts one can do. The spirit of volunteering and sewa was seen here in its purest form.

The planning started a year ago with our NGO partner Ratna Nidhi Charitable Trust and a cement company, ACC Limited. ACC provided the premises, 8 minibuses to collect patients, snacks and tea, volunteer's accommodation and logistics. Ratna Nidhi provided the prosthetics team, the medical contacts and helped build the vision.

The first day provided us with many teething problems; doctors, queueing, clothing, food and medicine problems to name just a few. However, our team was superb. So superb I wish to give them the kudos they deserve. From age 19 to 78 our team was Mukesh, Ninna, Niyanta, Champa, Hitesh, Pratula, Rasmita, Ansuya, Nirmala, Paras, Parul, Rashmita, Dhruv, Amit, Dina, Lalji, Mahesh, Mahendra, Mahesh, Dhiru, Vipul, Joytika, Kalpana, Priti, Yogesh and myself, Ajay. This team came up with ideas to resolve all issues that were in our hands. From a queuing system with raffle tickets to making the cooks start earlier and to alternate between making samosa and bateta vada and giving the doctors, dentists and optometrists some of the medications at their respective stations so the patients didn't have to then queue again at the pharmacy. Each evening the team would have a debrief to troubleshoot problems and share stories and ideas. There was no hierarchy, and everyone was equal. All ideas were listened to, even Mukesh's, and some implemented.

The team lived and breathed the camp for a week. Each member of the team will have numerous stories to tell and will have an overall feeling of gratitude and thankfulness from the lives they lead and the comforts they have.

At the camp, the villagers were provided with health consultations, cancer treatments, cataract surgeries, spectacles, prosthetic limbs, gynaecology checks, dental extractions, fillings, medicines, back and joint supports, walking sticks, wheelchairs, physiotherapy, clothes, refreshments, etc for FREE OF COST. Several awareness workshops were also held to educate people on mitigating and better managing lifestyle-related problems and high-risk diseases.

To tell you how many lives we've touched,

It's 10,402!

Gynaecology: 195 ladies screened for pap smears/mammography (awaiting results)

Dental: Over 2000 dental check-ups and over 200 pre-cancerous lesions detected and treated

Pharmacy: Over 6000 prescription checked and medicines given

Prosthetics: Over 900 new limbs given

Opthalmology: 200+ cataract operations have been scheduled, 400 pairs of spectacles given to school kids, 700+ sunglasses given out

Physiotherapy: 2000+ physiotherapy consultations where we diagnosed common local issues giving out 900+ lumbar belts, collars and knee braces, 3 new cancer cases were detected, 9000+ garments given, 40,000+ cups of tea, 20,000





samosas And thousands of bananas, biscuits, books, pens given. Some significant cases

Priyanka Maya, a young lady with cerebral palsy came with her parents who were looking for some cream. Her parents were alarmingly unaware of the complexities and details of cerebral palsy and sadly they thought that a cream would heal their daughter's condition. Her story was sad, her mother had lost four babies during childbirth. Her father earns only £60 a month and uses alcohol to relieve stress and for the same reason, her mother eats Khara. Priyanka is uneducated and she doesn't speak but understood everything. She was so small for her age and her parents used to carry her around and this took up most of their time. We gave her a wheelchair for a start, and have applied for an Aadhaar card. Getting registered will ensure she gets onto the correct healthcare systems and some much-needed help. We arranged treatment at a private clinic which has now started and will give Priyanka a hope for better days ahead.

Pramila Kampli has a severe case of cleft palate which her mum had refused to allow the simple operation when she was a child. Priyanka is married but has zero confidence in life and cant talk to her husband. Whenever Pramila drinks water the liquid comes out of her nose, she can't eat properly and has never been able to. A surgery consultation was arranged and treatment is currently underway. It is quite a basic operation that is needed. The follow up team will keep an eye on her as her case progresses.

Ravi Gadamwar had a boil which was previously treated two months back but Ravi continued to eat Khara and the boil has now turned cancerous. In front of everyone, Ravi declared he will stop eating Khara and only then will he likely live more than one year and receive the treatment that he badly needs. Ravi is currently being treated and the team from Mumbai will continue to follow up his case.

These cases highlight how this mega camp was different from other medical camps. We arranged for immediate hospital treatment for many other people and will continue to monitor their progress via local doctors and proactive volunteers.

Astonishingly Khara is cheaper than sweets! Boys and girls as young as 5 are given this harmful tobacco by their parents. Older children get it from their Shooter, the dealer. The general awareness of cancer is starkly lacking and people use Khara to suppress their hunger and avoid tiredness. Life expectancy is lower than 50 for many addicts in this part of Maharashtra. This is a figure similar to war-torn parts of Africa. India is supposed to be developing fast but, in the villages, this is not the case.

A lady whose husband was killed by local gangsters also suffered when she witnessed her son, Vishnu Sant's leg being cut off on the train tracks so that he could beg. They live on these same rail tracks! This is not a Bollywood film this is real life and was all witnessed at the camp. As this is a gang led area, I'm sure these stories are common.

We even helped little 15-year-old Sakshi Gokuldas who was getting eye pain and was struggling in school. All she needed was some spectacles and whilst we take for granted that we can go to the optician and get glasses this is not the case for many school children. Their parents simply can't afford the transport or the treatment

I even had a 60+-year-old farmer touching my feet as a sign of respect as a result of simply receiving a jumper. Such simple things we can all do in our lives even in the UK.

We're looking to improve more and more lives every year and if you're reading this and feel like you'd like to do sewa, keep in touch with us and see you at the next camp. We especially need the volunteering services of medical professionals.

Marathon Centurion – Piyush Gudka

Sports and fitness is becoming more popular amongst the Oshwal Community and we are embracing some events which a few years ago one may never have thought of taking part in.

Marathon running (26.2 miles / 42.2 km) is a classic example. The first recorded Oshwals to run the London Marathon were in 1994 (Mrs Chandra Pravin Malde, Mr Vipool Khetshi Shah, Mr Paresh Dodhia and Mr Piyush Zaverchand Gudka). Since than many more have participated in London and other marathons.

Every year there are new participants in the London Marathon, some of whom know each other because they have trained together or through friendship/relationship. Others are "anonymous", and below is a summary of the number of Oshwal London Marathoners from 2003 to 2018.

Meanwhile, Ms Rupal Ramesh Shah, ex Moshi in Tanzania, living in USA, completed her 10th international marathon on the continent of Antarctica in March 2019, and her 11th international marathon in Sydney Australia in Sept 2019, making her the first Oshwal to have run a marathon in all seven continents in the

world.

Piyush completed his 25th London Marathon (102nd overall) on 28th April 2019 and 106th marathon on 3rd November 2019 – the Istanbul Marathon in Turkey running from Asia to Europe.

He is an unassuming 63 years old Kenyan born from coastal city of Mombasa, where he was active in sports, swimming and athletics, the latter without the marathons. It was much later in life in London that he took up marathon running. What has generally kept him going is the training, motivation and inspiration he could provide to hundreds of people, young and old from 18 to 67 years old.

On average, Piyush gives 300 – 400 hours (including admin) of his time every year to advise, support and run with different people to help them realise their dreams and raise money at the same time. That is a huge sacrifice, given how busy and demanding modern life is. In total, his group has raised over US\$ 1 million for charities.

To keep his own flame burning, Piyush set up 6 ambitious milestones along the way which were critical for him to explain how he achieved all this:

- 1. The key strategy was dreaming big. He ran a major marathon in each of the six continents in under 11 months in 1997/1998 (South America, North America, Africa, Australia, Asia, and Europe).
- 2. The second was pushing the boundaries. Piyush ran two Ultra marathons the 89km Comrades Marathon in South Africa, and the Laugavegur Ultra Trail Marathon 55km in Iceland through volcanic ash, rocks, snow, rivers, mud, gravel, fog, rain and sunshine. It is only when you read the fuller details of Piyush's ultra marathons that you understand Art Turock's observation

There's a difference between interest and commitment. When you're interested in doing something, you do it only when circumstance permit. When you're committed to something you accept no excuse, only results

- 3. The third was accessing with his spiritual roots and connecting his mind with his body. In fact he competed the 2011 London marathon as iconic role model Mahatma Gandhi in every detail including costume, except running shoes and mobile phone.
- 4. The fourth came courtesy of a challenge posed to him of completing 60/60 Piyush completed sixty marathons on his 60th birthday in 2016!
- 5. It was then that the fifth "think really big" strategy got into his system and things went into overdrive. Piyush's 61st marathon to the 101st marathon (40 marathons) He completed this in early March 2019 when he competed in Tokyo.

Piyush summarises these angles as follows and the magic and power of his message is that these key principles are not marathon specific. They apply to any endeavor you undertake at any juncture in your life:

- 1. You have to enjoy what you're doing, be committed to your goal and crucially have sufficient time to fulfil your realistic goal.
- 2. There will be ups and downs along the way and plenty of lessons to learn.
- 3. Everyone's abilities are different and one should never compare oneself with another.
- 4. Be inspired and do the best according to your ability and circumstances.

Final word from the Centurion: "Marathon is a race where all are equal at the start line, but one can end up becoming a hero at the finish line! But seriously, all are winners!"



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
Empire's Child: My Writings 1967-2017

Profile of the author and more about the book

Ramnik (RKD) Shah was born in 1941 in Mombasa, the youngest child of Paniben and Khimji Devji (Sumaria) Shah (ex-Khirasara) who had migrated to Kenya in 1917. After his schooling he came over to England for further education and qualified as a Barrister in 1962. He finally returned to Kenya on 11 December 1963, on the exact eve of independence. His personal

account of that exciting homecoming appears in Robin Neillands` A Fighting Retreat: The British Empire 1947-97 (ISBN 0 340 635207) at p 4/5. He was among the last of his generation to go back to Kenya after studies in the UK; most of those who came later simply stayed on here.

Ramnikbhai then practised as an advocate in Nairobi from 1964 to 1974. This was a period of enormous change and challenges in Kenya and he is proud to have witnessed and been part of all that was happening then. He was a regular contributor to the op-ed pages of the local newspapers, and reports of court cases he was involved in also enhanced his media profile. He played a leading role in the fight against the 1968 legislation barring the free entry



of British Asians into the UK, both in Kenya and subsequently in Britain. In the wake of the 'exodus' crisis, he was appointed Acting Secretary of the Kenya Indian Congress. He was also elected to the Council of the Law Society of Kenya, of which he was later to become Vice-Chairman. He represented Kenya at the 4th Commonwealth Law Conference in New Delhi in January 1971, where he openly criticised the British government for the racially discriminatory nature of the 1968 Commonwealth Immigrants Act.

Towards the end of 1974, Ramnikbhai (together with his wife and their young son) left Kenya to settle permanently in Britain. In 1975 he was enrolled as a Solicitor (the first Oshwal to be so admitted) and practised as such at Mitcham in south London for the next 30 years until retirement. Since then he has been engaged in academic research and writing, travel and other pursuits.

Ramnikbhai became active on the Oshwal front in the 1980s and `90s. He was elected as an OAUK Trustee sometime in 1984/5 but resigned after a short spell. He was also an integral member of the Oshwal Accountants Group and participated in many of its activities. During those years, he also used to appear frequently on the BBC Question Time programme as a member of the audience who put and debated questions from the floor, and likewise on its sister programme `Any Answers` on Radio 4 (at a time when Asian presence on such forums was rare) on matters of domestic and international policy and public issues generally. His letters in The Times and other British national and local (and previously Kenyan) papers, over the last six decades, are a veritable record of his views on all manner of topics.

The broad range of Ramnikbhai's work and interests can be glimpsed from this book. As described in the publishers' synopsis, it is a selective compilation of articles, magazine columns, book and film reviews, blogposts, travelogues and academic papers from a variety of historical, legal and cultural perspectives on our lived experience of the postcolonial movement into Britain of the East African Asians. The book is divided into ten parts, each with a number of chapters, pointing to their varied subject matter ('The History', 'The Law', 'The Culture' etc.), with a detailed list of contents.

The opening chapter, 'The Nationality Factor in the Migration of Indians to East Africa and Beyond', should be read by everyone. It will serve as a valuable point of reference to Oshwals who may be interested to know (and/or explain to their friends, colleagues and others) that what lay at the root of our migration from India to East Africa and from there to the UK was the British Empire connection.

The colourful graphics on the front cover of the book are a striking illustration of the Empire motif – the interconnectedness between India, East Africa and the UK. This is also neatly captured in Chapter 6 of Part One: `They came in Dhows and Left in Jets`. Other chapters deal with different aspects of our story – settlement and betterment, struggles with the colonial establishment, the politics of independence, uprooting and dispersal and so on.

In the first chapter under Part Two, 'The Law', we learn more about the 1968 'exodus' and the part Ramnikbhai played in the fight against the 1968 Act, both at the time of its passing and over the next 34 years until that wrong was 'righted' in 2002.

As regards Part Three, all the books reviewed have an African or a diaspora related theme and Ramnikbhai hopes that these will stimulate an interest in contemporary English literature, outside of the specialist areas of professional concern to most Oshwals. As for films, he says that if you have

seen any of them, the reviews will refresh your memory and add new insights; if not, you may want to see some of them!

Individual chapters in other parts of the book have their own focus. The one on `Barack Obama: An Accidental Mwananchi` should be of general interest - an accidental `citizen` of where? Another, `The Imperial Capital 1910 to 2010`, is about London over a hundred year period, with an imposing miniaturised photo of A M Jeevanjee (of Nairobi`s Jeevanjee Gardens fame) addressing a gathering of Victorian society`s metropolitan elite at a luncheon hosted by him at a leading hotel in, yes, 1910!

Then there is a piece about Wangari Maathai in London in 2007 and another on Pandit Nehru's first tv interview in 1953. But the one that will appeal to the younger folk is, wait for it, on 'FRIENDS', the American sit-com series, of which Ramnikbhai is a fan!

Other examples are an academic study of Gandhi and Jinnah and another on V S Naipaul and Paul Theroux's writings about India; a sub-chapter on Muslim related topics and Travelogues on Cuba, India and the Americas. There is lots more, and in overall terms the message of the book is that we have come a long way from the land of our ancestors.

The softcover paperback has a nice feel, in appearance, size, colour and print. There is also an e-book edition, and both are available via the publishers` website or through Amazon, WH Smith, Waterstones and other major outlets at a modest price.

HEALTH WELFARE & ENABLING NETWORK PORTFOLIO Report

One of the highlights is the OAUK Funding arrangement with NHSBT for Organ Donation Awareness Campaign and the UK Law Change affecting Donors in 2020. OAUK project (Title Save Lives - Pass it ON) campaign will complete in March 2021. Many Black and Ethnic Minorities (BAME) organisations are party to this and have won funding from NHSBT for this programme. Generally speaking Organ Donation awareness amongst minorities is relatively low and so is the number of registered donors. Many recipients



have therefore a long wait for a suitable transplant to improve their life. UK government have therefore agreed to bring in a new law (Spring 2020) to change the donor registration. In effect, Donor registration from OPT IN will change to Donor registration OPT OUT to improve potential donor pool. OAUK has held and will continue to hold stalls at key events to highlight Donor issues. Please make every effort to visit and register to become a donor.

OAUK have agreed a Policy Statement (May 2019) for Carers accompanying Oshwal Members with disabilities to OAUK organised ticketed events. This means that one accompanying carer is admitted without a fee. Enabling Network (EN) has been active for the last 9 years and will be celebrating 10th Anniversary this year. To commemorate this, a special event is being planned in the Autumn at Oshwal Centre. Please look out for further details. ESSC sessions (Social & Sports Sessions) are now held at Ekta Centre and Preston Manor High School. Oshwal members with disabilities are encouraged to join in. I would like to thank EN Committee for their dedicated support.


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

Health Awareness Seminar

Background: On 14th September 2019 Oshwal West Area held a Health Awareness Seminar at Oshwal Shakti Centre. This was a historical event for Oshwals in UK! Why? Because for the first time in Oshwal

history, a Healthy, Tasty, Jain, Vegan, Raw and Gluten-free dinner with fresh fruits, vegetables and other wholesome ingredients was served.

We had an early morning start to the day with volunteers preparing fresh food. One of the side benefits of the raw food was that the washing up only took a few minutes as there was no grease in the pots.

Learning: We learnt from the Lecture that our body is a natural object and nature can cure us and keep us healthy.





The 4 steps we need to become healthy are:-

- 1. Fast for a 16 hour period daily *
- 2. Break the fast with a green juice (fibre filtered out)
- 3. When hungry, eat raw vegan food **
- 4. Take enema
- * Fasting can be achieved in 1 of 2 ways: No food or drink for 6-8 hours after waking up. Alternatively, aim to achieve a 16-hour period daily when no food or water is taken. For example, finish by 4pm, resume at 8am the next morning.
- ** Remember that hungerless-eating and over-eating are harmful.

It usually takes three months of following these 4 steps strictly to cleanse yourself of toxins. Stubborn issues like skin or blood may take longer. The process can be intensified by replacing step 3 with just vegetable juice (fibre to be filtered out). During this process, sometimes a "healing crisis" can occur such as diarrhoea, headache, temperature, vomiting, etc.. This is a sign that the body is now eliminating toxins.

Testimonials: Afterwards came testimonials by a number of people who have cured themselves without conventional medicines.

- 1. A 70 year old explained how she cured herself of high blood pressure, knee problems and diabetes. As a bonus, lost quite a bit of weight!
- 2. A 57 year old explained how she cured herself of severe arthritis which she had suffered from the age of 21. Now she is able to play hockey with people in their 20's!

Dishes served were Stuffed Tomato, Petis, Raw Mung Dal Shaak, Vegetable Bhel, Sweet Red Chutney, Hot Green Chutney and Double-Melon Fruit Salad with Home Made Nut & Seed Milk.

The five worships below are destroyer of all sins and this is the first beneficent among all benefactions

- 1. I bow to the Arihantas (with body), the omniscient (knowing everything).
- 2. I bow to the Siddhas, the bodiless liberated souls.
- 3. I bow to the Acharyas, the heads of the four fold order.
- 4. I bow to the Upadhyays who are next to the head.
- 5. I bow to all the Saints in the universe.

We call the above as the Namaskar Mantra because all Jains bow to all the padas mentioned above with mind, body and speech and honour it highly. The Mantra has two Lords: - Arihantas and Siddhas, three Gurus: - Acharya, Upadhyaya and Sadhu. These five collectively known as the five excellent Souls make up of five padas.

Arihant Pad –First post in Navpad- a person who is purest soul in the universal with a physical body. No anger, greed, hatred, ego and deceitfulness would be present in this soul.

Siddha Pad – Second Post in Navpad - Liberated Soul. He is the purest soul in the universe without a physical body. One becomes Siddha after attaining salvation.

Acharya Pad -Third post in Navpad. Acharya is the successor of Arihant and leader of the four-fold Sangh established by the Arihant.

Upadhyaya Pad - Fourth post in Navpad. He preaches monks and nuns.

Saadhu Pad - Fifth post in Navpad. He would practice 5 vows – abstaining completely from violence, lie, stealing, sexual conducts and possessions of earthly things.

Happy New Year to you all!

There has been a lot of work going on in the background over the Autumn and Winter months

since planning permission was granted back in Sep 2019 to allow the premises at Windmill Rd to be used as a Community Centre with 'D1' Classification. The Property committee carried out a consultation with all the various sub-committees of the South Area to find out their needs from the new centre, all the items have been captured into a master list which will be used during the design and fit out of the new centre to ensure that the facilities cater for the needs of our activities. The committee has also agreed to name the new centre 'Oshwal Shanti Centre'.

The appointed architects have been working in the background, carrying out many site surveys required to compile the tender documents. These were completed and sent out to several contractors inviting them to submit tenders. As of the middle of February we have received back the tenders and are in the process of reviewing the details. We aim to have appointed the contractors to carry out the works by the middle of March and will work with them to agree a start date as soon as possible. The work is anticipated to take between 9-12 months.

Whilst the Oshwal Shanti Centre is being refurbished we will continue to utilise Oshwal House, 1 Campbell Rd for our Ghar Derasar and smaller regular activities, the lease has been extended for a further 18 months until Jul 2021. Harris Academy Purley will continue to be used for Gujarati School, Sports & Social and Bridge clubs. We are considering options for Paryushan this year and will notify everyone in due course.

Our South Area AGM is taking place on 22nd March 2020 at Harris Academy, Purley, you will all be receiving notices shortly. This year is an election year and we would welcome some new younger members to join the committee and bring some new and fresh ideas for activities in the next 2 years.

He visited our house in the late 1980s with a view to encouraging me to donate £120pa, that scheme still runs with many members contributing regularly. He will be missed.

When you receive this edition of Oshwal News, work on our new centre will be underway. We aim to have completed the work by the end of the year. Building our new centre requires a huge amount of effort, with people giving up their time to ensure our community has a centre that the whole of Oshwal can be proud of. This is a major project for our community, as a whole, and we welcome donations towards the project large and small.
