### Derasar Extension, Tushar Jayantilal Shah, Chairman Project Sub-Committee

Our Derasar at Oshwal Centre was completed in 2005 and the Inauguration was celebrated with 10 days Pratishtha. Since than our Derasar has been a focal point for Oshwals but also the wider Jain community regularly attending for Darshan or Puja.

Approximately 5 to 6 years back, we identified some aspects which needed to be addressed, like water entering the Derasar from the roof, the difficulty in doing darshan to the 3 Pratima's from a single point, moss growth on the outside, shoe racks exposed to the outside weather etc.

Just over 4 years ago, we concluded to extend the Derasar and address the weak points above. Plans were drawn up by Rajeshbhai Sompura (our Indian Architect) and a contract given to supply newly carved stone work and bring over an Indian team to work with local contractors to extend the front canopy of the Derasar by construction of 8 new pillars and 3 new domes on the extended front.

Once the new stone pillars and carvings arrived from India, we submitted applications for Indian workers to come from India. However, our country was going through Brexit and much immigration to UK was curtailed and we were faced with a major problem of material on site but no Indian specialist workers!!

Our Vice President Kaushikbhai Narshi Shah, took on the responsibility of engaging Immigration lawyers and raising issues with the Immigration department and awareness meetings with several MP's. After sheer persistence and dedication by Kaushikbhai, and 18 months later, we were given the good news that our Indian team were granted visas to come to UK to complete our work.

However, the delay of granting visas were a true blessing for OAUK, as during this time we had even more places in the Derasar where water was now entering from the roof. Once Rajeshbhai arrived with the Indian team, we had a joint meeting with our local architects / consultants and eventually concluded the work would have to be extended by removing the whole central dome where water was being absorbed and seeping in several places inside the Derasar. This was totally unexpected in our original discussions and greatly increased the costs for OAUK.

This was a major project for OAUK as each Dome stone piece had to removed carefully to prevent damage, cleaned, polished and replaced after the internal dome was protected with 3 waterproof layers.


I am pleased to confirm the water ingress has reduced by well over 99% and the only weak aspect is the water ingress, from the Shikar which were unable to remove as advised by both sets of Architects

- Highlights of Works undertaken:
  - 8 new pillars and Derasar extended at the front.
  - 3 new domes on newly built extension.
  - Widening the opening to the Derasar Ghabaro so that all 3 Pratima's can be worshipped.
  - Large dome removed and replaced after installing 3 different waterproofing layers.
  - New Flat "Fibre Glass" seamless roof installed.
  - New wider marble steps to entrance of Derasar.
- New Shoe racks semi enclosed under the new front extension.
- 2 new scuptures installed on the roof.
- Kesar rubbing table and sink installed on landing of Derasar.
- Special chemical applied to the exterior stone work to prevent water absorption and prevent moss growth.
- New Exterior lighting to the Derasar.

The newly extended Derasar has truly transformed the look and those of you who have attended for Darshan or seen it on our Zoom Satsang's have complimented on the work undertaken. On behalf of OAUK, I thank all the donors who have supported our various fundraising schemes for this work. These schemes are still open if any member still wishes to contribute. Please contact the Office, Jayeshbhai or any Trustee for further details.

Our opening ceremonies for the Derasar were planned for March 2020 but were postponed as a Pandemic was announced. The opening ceremonies did eventually take place in September 2021 and all the donors and families were invited (numbers were restricted due to the ongoing pandemic) This event was webcast on our own YouTube channel by our Zoom Team.

The grand finale of all the works was our Lighting ceremony on Diwali day function at Oshwal Centre and the picture below shows the Derasar in its glory in the evening.



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












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




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





















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## 2021ની સાલમાં થયેલા ઑનલાઈન કાર્યક્રમની રૂપરેખા



૧૫મી માર્ચ ૨૦૨૦માં કોવિડ ઉપદ્રવ આવ્યું અને બધાજ કાર્ચક્રમ ૨૬ (Cancel) કરવા પડ્યાં. પણ બધાજ ધાર્મિક કાર્ચ ઝુમના માધ્યમ દ્વારા સરસ રીતે થયા. ૨૦૨૧ના વર્ષમાં પ્રવેશ કર્યો અને બધાજ કાર્ય, ગયા વરસની જેમ ઑનલાઈન થયાં. ઘરમાં ૨ફીને બધાજ ધાર્મિક પ્રવૃતિમાં જોડાયેલા રહ્યાં.

માર્ચની ૧૪ તારીખે માતૃવંદનાનો કાર્ચ ગોઠવેલ. ફોટા સાથે સ્લાઇડ શો કરેલ. સંગીતકારોએ હ્રદયને સ્પર્શા જાય એવા ગીતો સંભળાવ્યાં. માર્ચ અને એપ્રિલ બે મહિના ધર્મ પ્રેમી ભાવિકોએ શુભ ભાવથી સાંકડી આયંબિલના તપ કર્યા. ૧૫ માર્ચથી ૩૧ માર્ચ સુધી પાઠશાળાના ૭ સત્ર (Session) થયા. જેમા સામાયિકના અને ચૈત્યવંદના સુત્રો, શુદ્ધ ઉચ્યારથી શિખ્યાં. ફાગણ સુદ ૧૨ા૧૩ના પાલીતણાની છ ગાઉંની ભાવ યાત્રા કરેલ હતી. ચૈત્ર મહિનામાં શાશ્વતી નવપદ આયંબિલની શરૂઆત થઈ. દાનવીરોએ £૧૦૦૮નું દાન આપી અને નવ દિવસનો આદેશ લીધેલ હતો. તેમના પરીવારના બે સભ્યોને સવારે પૂજા કરવાનો લાભ મળ્યો હતો. તેમજ પ્રભુ દર્શન, પૂજા, પ્રવયન આપણને સૌને ઘેર બેઠા લાભ મળેલ હતો. વૈશાખ સુદ ૧૧ના શાસન સ્થાપના દિન હતો. આપણા ઉપકારી શ્રી પ્રભુ મહાવીરે આ શુભ દિવસે સંઘની સ્થાપના કરી હોવાથી આપણને આ મહાન જૈન શાસનના સભ્ય બનવાનું સૌભાગ્ય પ્રાપ્ત થયું. દરેક આત્માને આદર્શ ગુણોનું ભેટ અપાવતું અને સકળ જીવો સાથે મૈત્રી ભાવોથી ભાવિત કરતું શાસન. દેવોએ સમોવસરણ રચ્યું હતું તેની ઉંડાણથી સમજણ આપવામાં આવી હતી.

પરમ પૂજ્ય પંન્યાસ પ્રવર શ્રી વૃજસેન વિજયજી ગણિવર્યશ્રી પાંચ જુલાઈના સોમવારે રાત્રે ૧૦.૨૫ મિનીટે સકળ સંઘના મૂખે નવકાર મહામંત્રનું સ્મરણ શ્રવણ કરતા પૂર્ણ સમાધી પૂર્વક કાળધર્મ પામ્યા. તેમની સ્મૃતિ ભાવ અંજલી પ્રાર્થના રાખેલ હતી.

સત્તરભેદી પૂજાના ૧૮ ટિકડીઓ કરેલ અને દરેકને એક એક પૂજા કરવાનો મોકો મળ્યો. શિખર ઉપર ધ્વજા રોપણ કરવાનો લાભ સુશ્રાવિકા અનિલાબફેન ફસમુખરાયને ફસ્તે થયો. જિનાલયનું પ્રાંગણ પ્રભુ ભક્તિમય બન્યું ફતું. ત્યાર પછી તરતજ ફાલારના બાવન ગામની ઝુમ દ્વારા ભાવ યાત્રા કરી ફતી.

અઢાર સપ્ટેમ્બરના જિનાલયનો આગળનો ભાગ વિસ્તૃત (extend) કર્યો હતો. તેમજ અંદર પણ જે ફેરફાર કરેલ તેની વિવિધ પ્રકારની વાક્ષેપ પૂજા, ભૂમિ પુજન, સ્થંભ પૂજન શિખર પૂજન અને દેરાસરમાં અનેક પૂજાઓ, જેનું ઉદ્દ્ધાટન સમારો (Opening Ceremony) રાખ્યું હતું. તેનુ વાક્ષેપ પૂજન કરવામાં આવ્યું હતું. સમય સંજોગ અનુસાર લાભાર્થીજ આમંત્રીત હતાં અને વાજતે ગાજતે ખૂબજ ઉલ્લાસ પૂર્વક વિધિ કરી હતી. સાધર્મિકો માટે ભોજનની સુવિધા રાખવામાં આવી હતી.

દિવાળીનો પર્વ આવ્યો. યોપડા શારદા પૂજન ફોલમાં થયું. લગભગ ૧૦૮ પૂજનીય ફાજર ફતાં. ભાવિકોએ છક તપ કરેલ અને દેરાસરમાં શાક્ષાત પ્રભુનો અભિષેક કરવાનો આનંદ થયો. ત્યાર પછી દરેકને પૂજા કરવાનો લાભ મળ્યો. પાવાપૂરી રચના, રંગોળી, અક્ષતના સાથિયા, જાતજાતના નૈવેદ, ફળથી, આંખને સ્પર્શી જાય એવું રમણીય દ્રશ્ય શોભતું હતું. લાભાર્થીઓએ પાવાપૂરી ભાવયાત્રા, સ્નાત્ર પૂજા, નવસ્મરણ અને ગૌતમ સ્વામીનો રાસ, સંગીતના સૂર સાથે, સાંભળીને સૌનો આનંદ નિરવિધ બન્યો.

નવેમ્બરની ૭ તારીખે જિનાલયને રાત્રે પ્રકાશ પાથરે (Lighting Ceremony) એવો કાર્યક્રમ રાખ્યો હતો. બપોરે સાધર્મિક ભોજન રાખ્યું પછી ભક્તિ ભાવના રાખેલ હતી. લાભાર્થી પરિવાર હાજર હતા અને સાંજના ઉદ્દ્ઘાટન હેતલબહેન શાહના હસ્તે થયું. દેરાસર અદ્દ્ભૂત શોભતું હતું. નવેમ્બર તારીખ ૧૯ના કાર્તિકી પૂનમનો સિદ્ધગિરી ગિરિરાજ પટ દર્શન ભાવ યાત્રાનો કાર્યક્રમ હોલમાં રાખ્યો હતો. ત્યાર પછી સાધર્મિક ભક્તિ રાખેલ હતી.

### Photography -Held on 11th April 2021 Ketan Shah CPAGB, BPE3

Ketan Shah is an award winner for his photography talents. He presented his mind blowing and breath-taking photograph images exceptionally well. He showed some 250 photos which he had captured. Ketan explained where they were taken and shared some of his tips to some interested members. It was so inspiring that we requested him to write an article about his journey to reach this stage of his hobby and he is still aiming to achieve some more.

"Having worked in the family business for most of my life, I had very little time to have any holidays. This was about to change, when in Dec 2006 having sold the business, I was now free to travel the world and see the places I had only dreamt of. It was about the time when digital cameras were taking off. I wasted no time and bought my first camera, a simple point and shoot. I had only ever used my dad's film camera a handful of times in my life.

Now with instant results using a digital camera I soon developed an interest in taking photos, initially just to capture the memories of these holidays. A couple of years later I upgraded to a Bridge camera and my images were now getting even better. In 2010 a friend suggested we join a club, Northampton Camera Club. I wanted to look the part that of a serious photographer and once again upgraded to my first SLR. I soon realised having talked to some of the members and seen their work that I was total novice. I didn't even know the basics. Luckily for me a kind mature Gujarati gentleman, who was a member of this club with several years of experience took me under his wing and began to teach me every aspect of photography. Being retired and having ample

time on my hands, I fully immersed myself into my newfound hobby. To a point, that it became an obsession.


Competitions are a thing in camera clubs, and I looked forward to entering every single one. It is here through critique that my photography improved immensely. As a beginner I had several knocks but that didn't deter me. In the 4th

year of joining, I was now ranked no 1 in the club, practically winning every trophy the club had to offer, in themes including portraiture, landscapes, wildlife, action and creativity etc

In 2016 an image I took of deer in Richmond Park won me a £1000 prize in the mammal's section in a competition featuring British Wildlife by the Sunday Mail newspaper.

It was time to move on and took the decision to join Duston Camera Club, the leading camera club in the county. I was eager to progress and learn from its members whose work I greatly admired having seen it in Regional Exhibitions and Club v Club Tournaments. In my third year there, I finished on top of the club's league table by winning the Monthly Competitions.





It was then I decided to gain qualifications. Having not done well academically at school I felt I wanted to achieve some status in my life. The Photographic Alliance of Great Britain (PAGB) which all photographic clubs are affiliated to offer merit awards to all its members and in 2017, I entered some of my work for adjudication and was awarded the CPAGB, letters which I could proudly put after my name.

In the last three years I have been entering British Photographic Exhibitions (BPE), some 17 dotted around England where photographer from all over Britain enter their images in the hope of getting an acceptance and to win awards. For every acceptance you have had in an exhibition you receive one point. Currently I have had 164 acceptances and have won some 25 medals, ribbons, and trophies in total. The success in these exhibitions have earned me letters BPE3 which I can now add further to my name.

The journey is not over yet though. This month I am hoping to achieve the next level in the PAGB adjudications so I may now be termed as having gained DPAGB. Following that in the coming months I hope to achieve BPE4 for having had 200

images accepted in The BPE's. I have also had successful acceptances in International Exhibitions but awards there are still eluding me there. My intention is to change this soon.

I hope my story has inspired you to realized that you are never too old to set and achieve new goals. All you need is a strong commitment and determination!

Number 2 – you will meet the most amazing people on the trek. She got so much support along the way from complete strangers who were all amazed to see her determination and perseverance. They were all so positive, strong and confident. Most importantly they were all happy.

Number 3 – the trek tests you – staying positive is your only ticket to success. In particular the trek tests your patience, persistence and gratitude. There were stretches of constant vertical climbing, this can be the most exhausting. Not only physical difficulties but also the mental difficulties test you. At regular points we all checked up on her and gave her the option to return to base, we were all concerned about the impact of the incline on her knees. But she stayed strong and reassured us to continue with her!

She certainly was very resolute to get to the top, this determination and the incredible support she got along the way from strangers gave her the zest to make it all the way to the peak. Best view comes after the hardest climb.

My take on her experience is that you're never too old. If you have the right outlook and attitude, there's no reason why you can't experience the thrill and sense of achievement that goes with climbing a mountain.

And if you do, you'll swiftly come to realise that the notion 'age is just a number' applies to many of the things that you might like to do in life but previously thought you might be too old for.

The committee and I would like to pay our respects and pass on our condolences to Reteshbhai's friends and families during this difficult and unexpected time.




I hope you are all keeping safe and well. This Pandemic has been a challenging time for all of us. We have tried to maintain our activities via zoom or physical when the government guidance has allowed us.

When you read this, we hope we are in a better place so we can start to look forward and commence the work on Shanti Centre. We need your help in order to move the project forward.

Since purchasing the property at 58/60 Windmill Road, Croydon, CRO 2XP in Nov 2018, the Property Committee has worked tirelessly to get the Planning Permission granted by Croydon Council for us to be able to use the premises for our community purposes.

The layout of Shanti Centre will be split across two floors as below:





The tender process was in progress in early 2020 and by June 2020, we had shortlisted down to two contractors. The final due diligence was in progress to choose the ultimate contractor, however due to the Covid 19 Pandemic and uncertainty of cashflow, all OAUK Projects were put on hold.

We are now in a better position, however due to the pandemic labour and materials costs have increased. We need your help to support OAUK to bridge the cashflow issue and allow the project to be started as soon as possible.

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## Mukhtaben - Shri Rishabhdev Bhagwan's Painting

#### Muktaben's Journey with the painting of Shri Rishabhdev Bhagwan.

My name is Jaishmin Shah, daughter of late Muktaben Mohanlal Shah. In 1959 my mum went from Uganda to Dabasang, India. This was her first trip to her childhood home since her mum, Maniben, passed away.

During her visit, her dad, Punamchand Keshavji, took my mum and some of her siblings on a Jatra to Palitana. My mum acquired a beautiful painting of Rishabhdev Bhagwan during her visit in Palitana. From this moment the painting has been treasured by her throughout her lifetime.

On her return to Mbale, the painting was framed and displayed in our family home shared by the joint family of Gangabai and Narshi Manek Shah. The painting stayed there for over a decade.

In March 1972, during the Exodus, our family fled Uganda and went to India. The painting was unframed, rolled up and securely wrapped in a sari and placed in the one suitcase that she was allowed to carry.

In April 1973, the family came to the UK, together with the painting. A few years later, when we bought our family home, the painting was framed and displayed once again. Since then the painting of Rishabhdev Bhagwan has been displayed at many of our Jain celebrations.

My cousin, Jatin Shah, displayed it during the Sweet Harmony sessions as well as events for Young Jains. It was also displayed on the stage during the North West Area Paryushan at Byron Hall. Prior to building our Shikar-bandhi Derasar at Oshwal Centre, my mum loaned this beautiful painting to be worshipped at the Ghar Derasar in Oshwal house.

Whilst the painting has been in our family's possession my mum used to perform her daily prayers in front of the painting of Rishabhdev Bhagwan. My mum was a devout Jain and practised her daily Jain rituals until she sadly passed away in September 2015. Since then the painting has been at my home. In December 2020, I approached "The Repair Shop" in the hope they would consider restoring the painting to its former glory. After several months of communication, the painting was finally going to be restored!



Over the years, in the painting, creases have been formed, the colours have faded, pure gold has flaked off and paper cracked. Louise Drover, an Art Conservator specialising in paper, prints, drawing and historic wallpaper, took on the mammoth task. The artwork was cleaned, chipped and flaked paintwork was covered and she even used 24-carat gold to replace the original in missing areas. Throughout the restoration process, Louise observed the Jain principles by using alternative methods to avoid animal products like gelatine. Louise's work on the painting, including an interview with me about my mum's journey with the painting of Shri Rishabhdev Bhagwan, was aired on the BBC 1 programme 'The Repair Shop' on the 19th of January 2022. This programme is available to watch on BBC iPlayer - The Repair Shop, Series 8, Episode 13.

#### **Joys of Cycling in London**

The biggest thing I've learnt is there is no such thing as bad weather (just bad gear) and your skin is waterproof!:)

I have since become a Breeze ride leader in Harrow, and I would encourage all women who are interested in cycling to join the group by registering on the website http://www. letsride.co.uk and join the Breeze group in your area. There are groups in Harrow, Hillingdon, Barnet, Ealing, Enfield, Brent, to name a few. We cater for all abilities and levels of cycling and our aim is to get more women into cycling and enjoy its benefits.

To give you an idea of where we cycle, recent rides from Harrow (on quiet roads) have included cycling to Regents Park, Richmond Park, Windsor Castle, Bhaktivedanta Manor, Cycle superhighways in London and the Chiltern hills. Shorter rides include rides to local parks, green spaces, canals and lovely cafes for cycle stops. London highlights have
